

Discussion Questions - 6/18/23

Mark 9:2-29

Here are three basic questions you can always ask in any bible study:

- What does this text teach us about God?
- What does this text teach us about ourselves?
- If this text is true, what should we do to obey this teaching? This answer ought to be specific, in that it can be clearly measured.

Here are some specific questions about this text:

1. When Peter sees the glory of God in Jesus he is very afraid. Why? Take a look at Exodus 33:18-23 to see why Peter is afraid.
2. When we see that the glorious God (Jesus) will die in our place so that we can have an intimate relationship with God, what does this call us to do?
3. How often do you feel like your faith is somewhat weak?
4. How does the phrase “I believe, help my unbelief” give us encouragement and guidance to help us in our own weaknesses?
5. 2 Corinthians 12:9-10 gives us the paradox that our weakness is often the point where the strength of God moves into our lives? Do you have any personal examples of this in your own life?
