

### **Discussion Questions - 5/11/25**

#### **Psalm 8 - Where is Your Identity?**

Here are three basic questions you can always ask in any bible study:

- What does this text teach us about God?
- What does this text teach us about ourselves?
- If this text is true, what should we do to obey this teaching? This answer ought to be specific, in that it can be clearly measured.

Here are some specific questions about this text:

1. Honestly, who or what can form your functional identity when your functional identity is not in Christ? (Career, family, leisure, money, security, other people, friends or ???)
2. How hard is it to believe that our God is a God who works in weakness? Why is it hard to live in light of this truth?
3. Why is it easy to look at the vastness of our universe, the pain and suffering we have brought into the world through our sin and conclude that God certainly doesn't care or think about us very much?
4. Why, according to Psalm 8, does God take notice of human beings, including you?
5. How can you keep your dignity and nobility in view during the week?
6. According to Hebrews 2, Jesus died in our place to restore us to the nobility, and managers of the world. How can you keep that before you during the week?
