Romans 1:18-23 - Why We Need A God Who Opposes Our Rebellion

Here are three basic questions you can always ask in any bible study:

- What does this text teach us about God?
- What does this text teach us about ourselves?
- If this text is true, what should we do to obey this teaching? This answer ought to be specific, in that it can be clearly measured.

Here are some specific questions about this text:

- Are you comfortable or uncomfortable with the idea that God is a god of wrath? Why?
- What does creation clearly show us about God?
- Rejection of God is called a suppression of truth? Why is that? Why would we all be prone to suppress the truth about God and His opposition to our sin and rebellion?
- How does an ungrateful heart evidence a turning away from God?
- When we fail to see the glory of God, how does that create darkness and futility in our own hearts?
- When we reject God in any way we set up a replacement 'deity' of some kind. What are your most likely 'gods'?
